1. Historical Perspective-An Introduction

Rabindra Nath Tagore Govt. College Sarkaghat was established in the year 1985. Since its inception, it has grown up as premier institution of higher learning with strength of 2000 plus students on its roll and establishing high standards of human values.

This institution is situated among lush green sprawling ground and surrounded by the Chandrakri and Maseran small hills, presenting a nice view of sunrise and sunset. It is located two kilometer away from Sarkaghat town at the left bank of Sirkhad, which is one of the major tributary of Satluj river, originated from the holy Shiv Mandir of Sarkaghat. The college has wide open campus of about twenty acre along with right side of Sarkaghat-Shimla state highway.



This college is having the largest land mass in the state. The infrastructure has also developed to the need of hour. Two modern computer labs with latest configuration, Broadband internet, smart class with interactive power board, projector and Podium facility is at the disposal of students. A Girls hostel with capacity of 105 students is functioning. There is an automated library with internet facility having more than 16000 volumes of books. A separate departmental Library with broadband ICT connectivity under National Education Mission in the computer lab, Text Books, e-books, e-journals facility and latest edition of BCA/BBA/PGDCA books is also running in the SFS block to help the students. A facility of book bank is available in the college for needy students.

5. Eligibility for Admission in UG Courses (BCA/BBA 1st Semester))under RUSA)

Overview:

The admission to the BCA/BBA courses will be done on the basis of MERIT in qualifying examination.

Eligibility Condition:

For BCA 1st Semester: Candidates who have passed 10+2 examination from H.P. Board/CBSE/ICSE or any of examination considered equivalent to 10+2 by the Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla-5 with 40% Marks (35% for SC/ST category), shall be eligible.

For BBA 1st Semester: Candidates who have passed 10+2 examination from H.P. Board/ CBSE/ ICSE or any examination considered equivalent to 10+2, by the Himachal Pradesh University Shimla, with 45% marks (40% marks in case of SC/ST category) shall be eligible.

Age Limit:

For BCA 1st Semester: Maximum age limit for admission to BCA -1st semester is 21 years for general category, 24 years for SC/ST category and 23 years for girl candidates, as on the 1st July 2022. The Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of three months.

For BBA 1st Semester: Maximum age limit of the admission to BBA course is 23 years for general category and 25 years for girl candidates, as on 1st July of the year 2022. Relaxation of three years is given to SC/ST candidates and the Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of six months.

Note: Admission to BCA/BBA 3rd and 5th semester will be done under ROLL-ON basis as per SPU and H.P. University schedule.

- College will be charge fee for academic year for full twelve months in two installments.
- The fee is to be deposited by the candidate with in the given date and time at the time of admission, failing which seat will be allotted to the next candidate in the merit list.
- First installment: At the time of admission.
- Second installment: November/December.
- Fee once deposited shall not be refunded as per the AICTE norms.
- Fines and other dues, if any, shall be charged as and when these are notified.

Note: Rs. 100 will be charged as student welfare fund/PTA fund per semester.

9. Dress Code

Students of BCA/BBA will be required to wear the prescribed dress on all working days except one day as decided by college authority and notified in the notice board. It shall consist of shirt and trouser for boys and girls.

Summer: White Shirt, Black Trouser, Black leather shoes, Black Belt, Black Necktie and white socks.

12. Student Course-wise Assessment and Evaluation

All courses involve an evaluation system of students that has the following two components:

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA-30Marks).

End-Semester Examination (ESE-70marks)

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA-30Marks):

This would have the following components:

Class Attendance (5marks):- Each student will have to attend a minimum 75% lectures/Tutorials/Practicals. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the End-Semester Examination (ESE).

Mid Term Test (15 marks): There will be a Mid Term Test in month of September for odd semesters and March for even semesters. The Mid Term Test will be for 15 marks. 14

Seminar/Assignment (10 Marks): The remaining 10 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of seminar/assignment etc. that the course teacher might give to the students.

End Semester Examination (70 Marks):

Theory Paper: For Regular students each paper will be of 100 marks (70 marks for End Semester Examination and 30 marks for Continuous Comprehensive Assessment) and duration of each paper will be 3 hours. Internal Assessment will be given on the basis of Mid-Term Test, Assignment/Presentation and regularity.

Practical Examination: Duration: 3 hours.

Max. Marks: 50

CCA (Continuous Comprehensive Assessment): 35

ESE (End Semester Examination): 15

Practical exam will be conducted by the external examiner from the panel submitted to The Chairman, Computer Science Department, Himachal Pradesh University/Sardar Patel University Mandi H.P. and duly approved by the competent authority of the university.

a) Project Work :

In the **6th semester** the students of BCA/BBA have to develop one project, which will be evaluated by the external examiner from the panel submitted to The Chairman, Computer Science Department for BCA and Department of Management for BBA, Himachal Pradesh University, and duly approved by the university authority/evaluation branch, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla on the following basis:

1. Project Report 10 Marks (To be evaluated externally)

2. Seminar 15 Marks (To be evaluated internally)

3. Viva Voce 25 Marks (To be evaluated externally)

Note: 1. The pass percentage in each subject will be 40% for BCA & BBA.

13. Post-Graduate Course (PGDCA)

PGDCA: Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Application is one year program spread over in two semester and examination will be at the end of each semester.

Eligibility Condition:

Candidates who have passed graduation in any stream from the recognized university or its equivalent at least 50% marks (45% marks in case of SC and ST) shall be eligible.

Age Limit:

15. Leave/Attendance/Mid Term/Fine Rules

Leave Rules:

All students are expected to attend their classes regularly and punctually. In case the candidate is unable to attend the class he/she may apply leave on the proper application form.

Before proceeding on leave, it must be got sanctioned from appropriate authority and submitted to the office.

In case of illness the leave application must be supported by the medical certificate from Govt. hospital indicating the period advised for rest.

Leave up to two days will be sanctioned by tutor, upto four days by the senior tutor/coordinator and more than four days only by the Principal on the recommendation of the coordinator.

Identity Card:

Every student will be issued an identity card and will wear the card all the time while on the campus. The college authorities may ask the candidate to produce the same at any time.

Fine:

Fine as shown below will be charged from the students who fail to follow the leave rules:

Absence fine per period is Rs. 5/-

Library fine is Rs. 1/- per day per book.

Absence fine for seminar is Rs. 10/-

Absence fine from Mid Test is Rs. 50/- per paper.

Fine for not wearing dress is Rs. 50/- per day.

Lecture Attendance & Mid-Term:

As per SPU/HPU Ord. 62(b) and (c) Lecture attendance and mid-term/house test are compulsory in order to be eligible to appear in the University Exam. A candidate should have to attend 75% Lectures in each of the concerned course in theory as well as practical to be eligible for University exams. A student must have secure at least 20% marks in each subjects in the house examination or 25% of the aggregate marks.

His/her name will be struck off from the college roll if he remains absent for ten days continuously

Re-admission will be allowed only twice.

16. Ragging - A Menace and Social Evil

“Ragging” means the following:- Any conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing treating or handling with rudeness any other student, including in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique of fresher or a junior student.

PUNISHABLE INGREDIENTS OF RAGGING

Abetment to ragging/Criminal conspiracy to ragging

Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging

Public nuisance created during ragging

Violation of decency and morals through ragging

Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt

Wrongful Confinement/Wrongful restraint/Use of Criminal force

Assaults as well as sexual offence or unnatural offences

Extortion/Criminal trespass/Offences against property/Criminal Intimidation

Attempts commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim

Physical or psychological humiliation

PUNISHMENTS

The ragging is banned in the institution and any one including in ragging likely to be punished which included imprisonment, fine or both, expulsion from the institution, suspension from institution or classes for a limited period or fine with a public apology

The punishment also takes the shape of withholding scholarship or other benefit debarring from representation in events, withholding of result, suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess and the like.

DISCIPLINE: Discipline is essential to maintain the academic atmosphere in the college. The following acts of commission whether overt or covert shall constitute breach of discipline and the guilty shall be punishable under Ordinance 22.17 of HPU, which includes:

Writing indecent remarks on blackboard, walls or piece of furniture.

Making noise and disturbing classes/Smoking and drinking in or around the campus.

Plucking of flowers, chewing of pan, gutka and bubble gum.

Coming to college under the influence of intoxicants/drugs.

Spoiling, damaging or breaking college property such as-furniture, blackboard, electrical installations, fittings and window panes etc.

"रैगिंग" का अर्थ निम्नलिखित है: - कोई भी आचरण, चाहे वह बोले गए या लिखित शब्दों से हो या किसी ऐसे कृत्य से, जिसमें किसी अन्य छात्र के साथ छेड़खानी करने या अशिष्ट व्यवहार करने का प्रभाव हो, जिसमें उपद्रवी या अनुशासनहीन गतिविधियाँ शामिल हों, जो झुंझलाहट का कारण बनती हैं या होने की संभावना है या किसी फ्रेशर या जूनियर छात्र में डर या आशंका पैदा करना या छात्र को कोई ऐसा कार्य करने या कुछ ऐसा करने के लिए कहना जो ऐसा छात्र सामान्य पाठ्यक्रम में नहीं करेगा और जिससे शर्म या शर्मिंदगी की भावना पैदा करने या उत्पन्न करने का प्रभाव हो फ्रेशर या जूनियर छात्र के शरीर पर प्रतिकूल प्रभाव के रूप में।

रैगिंग की दंडनीय सामग्री:

- रैगिंग के लिए उकसाना/रैगिंग के लिए आपराधिक साजिश
- अवैध रूप से जमा होना और रैगिंग करते हुए दंगा करना
- रैगिंग के दौरान बनाया जन उपद्रव
- रैगिंग के माध्यम से शालीनता और नैतिकता का उल्लंघन
- शरीर पर चोट, चोट या गंभीर चोट पहुंचाना
- गलत कारावास/गलत संयम/आपराधिक बल का प्रयोग
- हमले के साथ-साथ यौन अपराध या अप्राकृतिक अपराध
- जबरन वसूली/आपराधिक अतिचार/संपत्ति के विरुद्ध अपराध/आपराधिक धमकी
- पीड़ित के खिलाफ उपरोक्त उल्लिखित अपराधों में से कोई एक या सभी अपराध करने का प्रयास
- शारीरिक या मनोवैज्ञानिक अपमान

दंड :

संस्था में रैगिंग पर प्रतिबंध है और रैगिंग सहित किसी को भी दंडित किए जाने की संभावना है जिसमें कारावास, जुर्माना या दोनों, संस्था से निष्कासन, सीमित अवधि के लिए संस्थान या कक्षाओं से निलंबन या सार्वजनिक माफी के साथ जुर्माना शामिल है। यह सजा छात्रवृत्ति या अन्य लाभ को रोकने, आयोजनों में प्रतिनिधित्व से वंचित करने, परिणाम को रोकने, छात्रावास या मेस से निष्कासन या निष्कासन आदि का भी रूप लेती है।

अनुशासन:
